Enjoy this weekend - smile, celebrate, get hands on and take in as much of what's on offer as you can in this wonderful town the festival calls home.



Venue Accessibility

The National Festival of Making takes over public spaces and venues in and around Blackburn Town Centre. The pedestrianised areas are very accessible for pushchairs and people who use a wheelchair however some of the activities take place in temporary marquees and gazebos where access may be restricted. We strive to work towards an accessible programme of events but regret that not all venues are fully accessible to our whole audience at present. Please find details below of venues that are not fully accessible at this time, or which have alternative access.

Unfortunately, Tony's Ball Room is on the upper floor with no lift access. The room capacity is limited to 50 people at one time and so there may be a small queue at the venue entrance.

There is single step access to Prism Contemporary, Uncultured Creatives Studio (14–16 Lord Street West) and 29 Northgate. The Cotton Exchange has new lift access designed into the building, and is accessible to people who use a wheelchair.

The Making Rooms has alternative level access through the side entrance on Museum Street.

Throughout this programme, if there are any activities listed taking place in venues where there is not level, ramp or lift entry, you will see this symbol . This will be followed by a short description of the barriers people might find to accessing this venue.

If you require any assistance or information, you can reach our team by speaking to one of the Event Staff who are wearing purple reflective vests. 





EXHIBITIONS TO SEE

YESS LAD

After a critically acclaimed run during Frieze London 2022, YESS LAD tours to the National Festival of Making.

Expect inspiring, humorous and vibrant work in a variety of mediums, from Dominic Bennett's ceramic *Army of Weasels* to Barry Anthony Finan's porcelain postcards, Horace Lindezey's irreverent, commemorative blue plaques to Violet Emsley's beautiful abstract paintings.

YESS LAD is a group exhibition of artists in collaboration with award-winning charity Venture Arts, a visual arts studio in Manchester that works with learning disabled artists to create and showcase new contemporary visual art. YESS LAD spent a month during autumn of last year showcasing the work of eight Venture Arts artists at TJ Boulting in Fitzrovia, in partnership with A Modest Show.

WAVE SWEEPER, SAPIEN + SWS UK



Inspired by folkloric stories unearthed during his residency with SWS UK - manufacturer of garage doors, roller shutters and retractable gates with a proximity to the River Lune - Sapien AKA Steve Anwar has created a new steel sculpture. Representing warriors of Manx mythology, Wave Sweeper is an expression of both the manufacturer's place in rural Lancashire and its wider geographic ties, as well as the artist's practice, informed by the opposing elements of mind and matter, nature and machinery, steel and spirit.



I SEE A VOICE, SAM BELINFANTE + PANAZ



Textiles have the capacity to conjure illusion and narrative; to speak through and from within the warp and weft. This installation and performative experience from Sam Belinfante was developed in partnership with leading fabric innovators Panaz. During the residency, the artist has investigated Moire patterns and the optical effects induced through the movement of sheer fabrics, to be experienced large scale within a striking physical environment at The Cotton Exchange.

This exhibition has low level lighting and features lighting effects with moving and flashing lights.




