

Venue Accessibility

The National Festival of Making takes over public spaces and venues throughout Blackburn town centre. Operating in a multi-venue environment presents challenges, and although we strive to work towards an accessible programme of events, not all venues are equally accessible to our whole audience at present.

Throughout this programme, if there are any activities listed taking place in venues where there is no level, ramp or lift entry, you will see this symbol \mathcal{P} . This will be followed by a short description of the barriers people might find to accessing this venue.
